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## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

Read the passage (Psalm 19:1-14) and answer the following questions:

1. What stands out most and why?
2. What does the passage reveal to us about God?
3. What does the passage reveal to us about ourselves?
4. What are the immediate application points?

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## DEEPER DISCUSSION

1. David begins this psalm with a statement about the heavens and the skies declaring God's glory. How do they speak? What is the message we receive when we ponder the heavens?
2. Read Romans 1:19-20. What sort of things are made clear and revealed through Creation? Share an experience with your group when you were you were aware of God's power and divine presence through Creation.
3. If it is so clear to see God in creation, why is it that so many refuse to acknowledge him? What is necessary for people to worship Him as creator?
4. Moving from Creation to The Law of the Lord, David says that it is perfect and "revives" the soul. How does the Law revive the soul? What is revealed to us in the Scriptures that makes us "wise unto salvation?"
5. David talks about how obedience to God's law and joyful submission to it is more valuable than wealth and more satisfying than delicacies like honey. Can you think of some practical reasons why it is better for a Christian to grow in obedience to God than in the things of this world?
6. David's response to God's glorious revelation is one of commitment. Spend time together praying for that same spirit of commitment and worship to be evident the hearts and attitudes of your group.
